REQUIREMENTS

Can be requested by

- · Educational establishments: for school and university students from formal education institution saccompanied by their teacher / professor (a maximum of two teachers / professors are allowed).
- · Cultural associations / organisations regardless of the nature of
- the group.
- · Tourism professionals.
- · Friends of the museum.

Reservation

· The guide may only book a single time slot (either for the permanent collection or a temporary exhibition) during which the guided tour will take place. If another space is required on the same day, availability must beconfirmed at the museum's Information Desk on the day of the tour.

Maximun number of people per group

· Maximum number of people allowed per visit: 8 participants and 2 guides/teachers/companions in permanent collection and temporary exhibitions.

Maximun guides per group

- \cdot A guide (maximum of 2 per tour).
- ·A teacher / professor (maximum of 2 per tour) accompanied by the students of his/her educational establishment. Status proof must be accredited with valid documentation at the Information Desk before the visit begins.

Group tour guide system

• The use of a group tour guide system (a microphone and receiver) is required both during tours of the permanent collections and of our temporary exhibitions except for Primary and Secondary schools group visits. The museum provides a micro-receiver rental service (\in 1 per receiver) for groups that do not have such a system. For touristic groups that have booked the reservation on the Professional Channel, micro-receivers will be provided free of charge. At the start of the tour the person in charge of the group will be responsible for explaining how to use the micro-receivers and at the end of the tour he/she must collect and return them all to the Audio Guide Desk from which they were collected at the start of the tour. The devices will be delivered clean and disinfected.

Opening hours

- · Thyssen-Bornemisza collections: Tuesday Sunday, from 10.00 to 19.00. Free entry on Mondays from 12.00 to 16.00.
- · Temporary exhibition level o: Tuesday Sunday, from 10.00 to 19.00. Saturday, from 10.00 to 21.00.
- · Temporary exhibition level -1: Tuesday Sunday, from 10.00 to 19.00. Mondays from 12.00 to 16.00. Saturdays, from 10.00 to 21.00. Please note that the galleries will be emptied 5 minutes before closing time

Times for guided tours

- · Thyssen-Bornemisza collections: Tuesday Sunday, from 10.00 to 18.55. Guided tours are not allowed on Mondays. The rooms will be emptied 5 minutes before the museum closes.
- Temporary exhibition level o: Tuesday-Friday, from 10.30 to 18.55. Sunday, from 15.30 to 18.55. Guided tours are not allowed on Saturdays nor Sundays from 10.00 to 15.30.
- · Temporary exhibition level -1: Tuesday Friday, from 10.00 to 18.55. Guided tours are not allowed on Mondays, Saturdays nor Sundays from 10.00 to 15.00. To book the visit to those rooms, contact to cavthyssen@museothyssen.org or +34 917 911 370.
- ·Due to the small size of the First floor balcony gallery, no explanations may be given to groups in this area.
- The rooms will be emptied 5 minutes before the museum closes.
- · These times are subject to change depending on specific exhibitions and the estimated duration of the tours.

Maximum duration of visit

- · 60 minutes for the temporary exhibitions.
- \cdot 75 minutes for the permanent collection.
- · The guide/teacher is responsible for keeping the group in silence and together, keeping a safe distance from others, making sure that other visitors can move freely around the exhibition rooms, and should always use an appropriate tone of voice (as low as possible) so as not to disturb other visitors.

PLEASE NOTE

- · The access of the group should be, at least, 15 minutes before their entrance time in order to access at the time of the reservation. It is imperative to respect the time slots so as not to disturb other people. Otherwise, we can not guarantee the access. No refunds will be allowed.
- The guide/profesor should show their identification at the Information Desk to register. Our staff will give them both stickers and micro-receivers for each member of the group. The stickers should be in a visible place during the entire visit. If someone arrives late, the group leader could leave the sticker with the person's name at the Information Desk.
- · People who wish to draw or write in the exhibition rooms may only do so on A4 sized paper and using a graphite pencil. Under no circumstances may painting materials or other items that may cause damage to the works of art (including tripods, monopods, selfie sticks, etc.).
- It is not permitted to use supporting material or take part in any other activity in the exhibition rooms. The guide / teacher may use a tablet, as long as it is used in a way that does not disturb the other visitors.
- · We ask visitors not to make or receive telephone calls in the gallery rooms. We also ask you to always use your headsets or earphones to listen to your mobile apps with tablets or mobile phones.
- · This free service also provides cane-seats (only available during visit to the permanent collection), baby pushchairs and wheelchairs available for visitor use. All these objects will be thoroughly disinfected after being used.
- ·Backpacks, bags, umbrellas, suitcases, toys, balloons, must all be left in the cloakroom before the tour begins. For security and hygiene reasons the following are not allowed: Clothing (during health alert), Food, beverages, animals or plants may not be left in the cloakroom.

No individual concessions nor free admission are granted to

- · ICOM Memberships.
- · Citizens officially unemployed.
- · Media professionals.
- \cdot Children and young people under the age of 18.

- \cdot To have purchased the tickets at least 24 hours in advance.
