At the Museo Nacional Thyssen-Bornemisza, the venue of this temporary exhibition, the Thyssen-Bornemisza Collection is also on permanent display, offering visitors an overview of art history from the 13th to the late 20th century. The museum is home to works by Dürer, Raphael, Titian, Rubens, Rembrandt, Caravaggio, Manet, Renoir, Cézanne, Van Gogh, Gauguin, Kandinsky, Picasso, Hopper, Rothko and other great masters of painting.

The exhibition The Magritte machine is the first retrospective devoted to René Magritte (1898–1967) to be held in Madrid since the one organised by the Fundación Juan March in 1989. The title The Magritte machine emphasises the repetitive, combinatorial element present in the work of the great Surrealist painter, whose obsessive themes constantly reappear with innumerable variations.

The exhibition is divided into the following sections: The magician's powers, Image and word, Figure and background, Picture and window, Face and mask, Mimicry and Megalomania. Curated by the museum's artistic director, Guillermo Solana, the exhibition brings together more than 90 works, including paintings and works on paper, in addition to a selection of photographs and films.


